Without new sources of revenue, CMSD's unencumbered cash balance will be -\$18.3 million by the end of the 2024-25 school year. As such, funding for the district's 93 afterschool programs may be threatened.

Clevelanders for Afterschool is a coalition of families, teachers, and community organizations that recognize the importance of CMSD afterschool programs in providing safety, academic support, life skills, and in building community for Cleveland students and their families.



The number of stolen cars in Cleveland rose 94% from Aug. 2022 to Aug. 2023, with most thefts carried out by teenagers




↑ The number of Cuyahoga County youth charged with homicide has nearly doubled since 2021

A SAMPLE OF STUDENTS WHO PARTICIPATED IN CMSD AFTERSCHOOL PROGRAMS FOUND:



scored an average of 7.7 percentage points higher on English/Language Arts State Tests compared to all students at their schools



have a school attendance rate of 7.6 percentage points higher compared to all students at their schools



scored an average of 4.2 percentage points higher on **Math State Tests** compared to all students at their schools
